UK university stats (Stonewall 2017 survey)

- 36% of trans students and 7% of LGB students who aren't trans have faced negative comments or conduct from staff due to being LGBT+
- 60% of trans students and 22% of LGB students who aren't trans have had the same from fellow students
- For 7% of trans students, this involved being physically attacked
- 42% of LGBT+ students hid the fact that they were LGBT+ at university because they were afraid
 of discrimination
- 20% of trans students were encouraged to hide the fact that they were trans by university staff

Respecting sexuality What is sexual orientation?

- Sexual orientation refers to who a person is attracted to
- Sexualities seen as LGBT+ are any that are not solely heterosexual—heterosexual being someone who identifies as a man being attracted to someone who identifies as a woman, and vice versa. Anything outside of this falls under the umbrella of LGBT+ identities.
- As this suggests, there's a lot of variation within that, and a lot of terms to describe various orientations under the LGBT+ umbrella.

Respecting gender

- **What is gender?** "Gender is hard to define but can be thought of firstly as a social structure, and secondly a loose set of traits that together form part of someone's identity. A lot of people have their own way of thinking about gender, that might include other facets besides these two basic points."

<u>Transgender</u> : if someone is transgender, they are a gender that is different to the sex they were assigned at birth. Often shortened to trans.	<u>Cisgender</u> : if someone is transgender, they are a gender that is the same as the sex they were assigned at birth. Often shortened to cis.
Intersex: someone who is born with both what are typically considered biologically male and female traits. Not the same as trans.	Non-binary: if someone is non-binary, they don't identify completely as either male or female—their gender is outside of these two options (hence, non-binary). Non-binary is an umbrella term, not a third gender as some people think.
Misgendering: misgendering refers to treating someone as a gender other than the one they are. Misgendering most commonly occurs through use of a dead-name, incorrect pronouns, and gendered terms.	<u>Deadname</u> : some trans people choose to change their name. The name that they were given at birth is often referred to among trans people as a deadname.
Pronouns: pronouns are the words used to replace someone's name in a sentence and are often gendered. As a result, the pronouns a person uses can be an important aspect of their gender.	Important to note that the language / terms are constantly evolving (e.g. transsexual used to be a widespread term but is now considered out of date and to some people offensive).
